## Harbor rules



### Prohibited area

Sailing in areas marked in red is prohibited due to shallow water or because the area is restricted for our boats.



### Keep distance from the shore

Please stay minimum 10 ft from the shore to avoid getting stuck in the algae and shallow water.



### Military base

Please stay clear of the military base.



### Speed limit buoy

Please respect the speed limit and do not pass the 10 mph buoy.



### No swimming from the boat

You are not allowed to jump off the boat for swimming etc.



### Base

Remember to be back at the base on time. You'll be charged extra if you return late.



### Toilet

Use the designated toilet by the gate. Do not use the harbor or its surroundings as a toilet. Please show respect towards our neighbors.

### The Anthem

Expansive, modern concert venue featuring a lineup of well-known live acts and many bars.

### East Potomac Golf Links

A golf course. Includes an 18-hole course, two 9-hole courses, and a miniature golf course. It opened in 1921.

### Southwest Waterfront Park

This park was established as part of urban renewal efforts in Southwest Washington, D.C. in the 1950s. Later the National Park Service installed the Titanic Memorial statue in the park in 1968.

### Titanic Memorial

This thirteen-foot tall figure is a granite statue that honors the men who gave their lives so that women and children might be saved during the RMS Titanic disaster.

### National War College

The NWC is a school which educates future leaders of the Armed Forces, State Department, and other civilian agencies through the study of national security strategy.

### Washington Monument

The Washington Monument honors and memorializes George Washington at the center of the nation's capital. Built in the shape of an Egyptian obelisk, evoking the timelessness of ancient civilizations, the Washington Monument embodies the awe, respect, and gratitude the nation felt for its most essential Founding Father. When completed in 1884, the Washington Monument was the tallest building in the world. It can be seen in the distance from the GoBoat route, but not sailed to.
