



## Sightseeing

- 1 Woodrow Wilson Memorial Bridge**  
The Wilson Bridge carries Interstate 95 (I-95) and I-495 Capital Beltway. The drawbridge on the original span opened about 260 times a year, frequently disrupting traffic on a bridge that carried about 250,000 cars each day. The new, higher span requires fewer openings.
- 2 Potomac River Waterfront Park**  
The park and river derive their names from an American Indian village on its southern bank, the home of the Patawomeke people. They were a sometimes-ally of the larger Powhatan Confederacy.
- 3 Betty Blume Park**  
Betty Blume Park is located in Prince George's County, Maryland. The elevation above sea level is 10 metres.
- 4 The Awakening**  
A landmark sculpture at National Harbor depicting the face and limbs of a man emerging from the ground.
- 5 The Capital Wheel**  
180-ft. ferris wheel offering 8-person gondolas, colorful lights and views of the Potomac River.
- 6 National Harbor SouthPointe**  
Southpointe is located just outside the Waterfront District and offers a stunning view of the National Harbor Marina.
- 7 Potomac River**  
The Potomac River is 405 miles (652 km) long and over 5 million people live within its watershed. On the left descending bank, the river forms part of the border between Maryland and Washington, D.C., and between West Virginia and Virginia on the right descending bank.



## Harbor rules



### Prohibited area

Sailing in the areas marked in red is prohibited due to shallow water or because the areas are restricted for GoBoats.



### Shallow water!

The yellow buoys indicate shallow water. Please keep a distance!



### No swimming from the boat

You are not allowed to jump off the boat for swimming etc.



### Base

Remember to be back at the base on time.



### Toilet

Use the designated toilet spots marked on the map. Do not use the harbour or its surroundings as a toilet. Please show respect to our neighbours.
