Harbour rules



Prohibited area

It is prohibited to sail in areas marked in red because of shallow water or the areas being restricted for our boats.



No swimming and getting off the boat

Guests must remain in the boat at all times, except in emergencies.



The captain needs to stay sober

Please take care of your safety and respect other users on the water.



Limit the noise

Please keep the noise down level to a minimum.



Keep distance from the shore

Please stay minimum 3 meters from the shore to avoid getting stuck in the algae.



Fishing lines

Please be aware of fishers and their fishing lines. Don't sail too close as the boat will clip the lines which will block the propeller.



Strong Wind

Please mind expected travel times and be aware that adverse weather conditions can affect the boat's performance.



Picnic

Allowed picnic areas, anchoring is possible here.



Do not litter

Do not throw objects into the water. Rubbish must be kept in the boat.

Oberbaumbrücke

While Germany was divided, the Oberbaum bridge was a border crossing for pedestrians. Since the fall of the Berlin Wall, it now connects the two halves of the district of Friedrichshain-Kreuzberg.

The Sunken Ship

MS Dr. Ingrid Wengler Ship - It was named after the owner's true love, a surgeon at the Dreifaltigkeits-Hospital in Lippstadt.

Molecule Man

Molecule Man is a series of aluminium sculptures, designed by American artist Jonathan Borofsky, installed at various locations around the world.

Wenden Park

Wenden-Park is part of Stralau Peninsula. The park includes the Friedhof Alt-Stralau church.

Treptower Park

Partly wooded park on the Spree with a promenade, biergarten, Soviet war memorial and observatory.

6

Plänterwald

The name Plänterwald derives from the German word Plenterwald, referring to a timber forest. Now part of Berlin, it was part of the former borough of Treptow and the site of its former town hall.

7

Funkhaus

Founded in a former plywood factory, Funkhaus became the focal point for East German broadcast in 1951. Today resident producers harness the great acoustic setting. Funkhaus regularly hosts a variety of artists.
